The Great commission was given by Jesus almost 2,000 years ago, yet this assignment is still unfinished! The School of Evangelism (SOE) is designed to prepare laborers to work in the fields that are “white unto harvest”.

The vision of the SOE is to prepare you to be a world changer and equip you to help complete the Great Commission.

The SOE will give you vital tools and skills to effectively relate the Gospel to other cultures and societies around the globe. SOE focuses on the character and ways of God and is designed to help you become a powerful and creative communicator of God’s truth. The SOE field trip will be a time of direct evangelism ministry and leadership training.

Since the SOE is a registered school with the University of the Nations (U of N), you may receive up to 20 U of N credits upon completion of the SOE.

COURSE CONTENT:

The SOE is divided into two phases: A three-month lecture phase followed by the two-month outreach phase.

I. LECTURE PHASE

The first three months of the SOE include the following aspects:

A. CLASSROOM CURRICULUM -- You will receive powerful teaching from Christian leaders and experienced missionaries on topics like:

1. Outreach Leadership Training

2. Apologetics
 - a. Effectively communicating the Gospel
 - b. Understanding the errors of non-Christian philosophies
3. The ways of God and His methods of dealing with mankind
4. Perspective on world missions
5. Christian leadership principles
6. Worship and spiritual warfare
7. Practical theology
8. Discipleship

B. SMALL GROUPS -- Purposes of the small groups are:

1. To build deeper relationships with one of the staff members and several other students.
2. To create an opportunity for students to ask questions regarding the teaching, share what God is doing in his/her life, and receive prayer and support from the group.

C. INTERCESSION GROUPS --

Intercession is prayer where we place ourselves in the place of identification with existing needs, seeking the Lord's direction on how to pray, and seeking His intervention in that particular situation. During these times we mainly focus on nations of the world and on needs other than our own.

D. PERSONAL DEVOTIONS -- This time is set aside each day for you to be alone with God. It's the most important time of the day for personal growth.

E. REQUIRED READING -- This is set up to complement the classroom curriculum. This list changes from school to school.

F. COMMUNITY RESPONSIBILITIES -- Each student works about two hours a day on the base. Some adjustments are made for families. There are also community responsibilities on the weekends. The purpose for community responsibilities is to:

1. Significantly keep the cost of the school down by providing needed help in areas such as maintenance, cooking, cleaning, and office work.
2. The Bible encourages us to do everything as unto the Lord. Working hard and with joy is a class in itself and therefore a vital part of the training.

G. DAILY SCHEDULE -- An average day during the lecture phase might look like below. Evenings are usually free to study and relax, but there will be some school meetings after dinner.

II. OUTREACH PHASE

As in the DTS outreach, the eight-week SOE outreach will give you an excellent opportunity to minister the love of Jesus to a needy, desperate world. Applying the principles and perspectives learned during the lecture phase, you will see how God can use you to show His love to others and extend His Kingdom on earth!

You will share Christ's love in various ways: child evangelism, dramas, music, sharing testimonies, church ministry, and practical help for the poor and needy. Students will also be given more responsibility and gain some leadership experience during the outreach.

Whenever possible, teams work alongside an existing local churches, referring new believers to that fellowship. After the outreach, the team returns to our base for a time of sharing what God has done.

REQUIREMENTS FOR SOE:

Applicants must be at least 18 years of age (or have a high school diploma\GED), and have successfully completed a DTS or CDTS.

AFTER THE SOME TRAINING:

Those who complete the SOE training have the opportunity to continue on, complete a School of Ministry and Development (SOMD), and join YWAM'S full-time staff here in Orlando, or at one of over 1000 bases around the world!
